



We provide 2 options of sedation for your dental procedures: General Anesthesia and IV Sedation

For Special Needs and Healthy Patients of Any Age

General Anesthesia: Patients are rendered unconscious by breathing in anesthesia gases by mask. Other anesthesia medications are delivered by an IV line which is placed after you're asleep.

IV Sedation: Patients are placed in a deeply relaxed state. Patients are provided with sedation medications through an IV line. The IV is placed and the sedation medications are administered.

Reasons for Considering Sedation:

- 1. Any patient who is unable to tolerate dental procedures without sedation (IV) or being asleep (general anesthesia).
- $2. \, Special \, Needs \, populations \, such \, as \, learning \, disabilities, \, Autism, \, etc. \,$
- 3. Children who are fearful of dental procedures.
- 4. Patients needing extensive dental procedures or surgery. This includes multiple extractions and/or dental implants and removal of wisdom teeth.
- 5. Severe phobia for routine dental procedures. Severe gag reflex or inability to become numb.
